#### **Expanding Women's Opportunities in the Valley**

Each summer, 7th grade girls from Coachella Valley schools take part in an immersion course in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) subjects at the University of California, Irvine. They stay in dorms on campus for a great adventure called Tech Trek.

This special week is designed to encourage their interest in the study of science and also to support their academic advancement.

The Tech Trek program has been sponsored for years by the local branch of the American Association of University Women, a national organization. Girls who return from this special week

describe the experience on a university campus as "exciting," "cool," and as a "life-changing experience."

This program enables these girls to see firsthand what a university campus experience is like. It also allows them to share the magic of discovery in classrooms and labs, just as an older student would. Tech Trek is just one of a number of programs and activities of the local branch of the AAUW. The national organization works to help girls and women to maximize opportunities and expand availability in education, rights and other areas.

The local branch, with over 120 members from across the valley, is one of the larger AAUW chapters in the United States.

Each month during the season AAUW holds luncheon meetings for all its members and guests, to showcase speakers on a wide range of topics. Recent speakers have included the dean of the California State University campus in Palm Desert, local writers, a representative of The Living Desert, local "weather guy" Patrick Evans, and a presentations on a range of topics and interest areas.

Other activities include regular "Great Decisions" meetings, where participants review current international affairs and issues important to the foreign policy of the country. Book discussion groups are also part of the activities open to members as well as a "Lunch Bunch" to share fellowship with others at local restaurants. A dine around group visits theaters with interested members. Guided trips for members include trips to presidential libraries, Sunnylands and any venue that might provide an interesting experience.

Membership is open to all who have a two- or four-year degree and have a wish to join a group of interested, and interesting, people. There are no required attendance regulations and the activities are affordable and accessible.


