Through the program featuring "The Invisible War" held on Saturday, November 8th, we are pleased to add \$450 to the fundraising donations received this year. This awardwinning, riveting film about harassment, sexual and otherwise in the military, was shown at the Tolerance Education Center in Rancho Mirage.

The fee for this event was \$15 per person and was all designated for the Legal Advocacy Fund. The Legal Advocacy Fund is used by AAUW for legal case support among other activities. This legal support is very important to assist AAUW in promoting equity for women and children.

AAUW FUNDS CELEBRATION LUNCHEON

On Sunday, October 19th AAUW held its Fall Celebration Luncheon in Seal Beach. Attending this event from our branch were members Gerry Johnson, Elizabeth Nash, Elaine Levey, Lynn Ostrick, Sue Beatty and Pat Ankeny. Hundreds of members from all over the Southern California Region of AAUW attended this wonderful event.

The purpose of this meeting was to update the branch about AAUW Funds, income, expenditures, provide a progress report and announce future plans.

Sharon Westafer, Chair of AAUW-CA Funds, reported that \$521,088.16 was donated in 2013 to various AAUW Funds. She also noted that California's AAUW membership numbers constitutes 20% of the national membership.

In addition to supporting other important programs, AAUW California Funds support 25 Funds Fellowship and Grant recipients studying in California colleges and universities, or doing projects in our communities. They are an excellent example of the wonderful use of branch and member donations.

We heard presentations from several Endowment Fellowships and Grant Recipients, and they all stated they were very grateful to AAUW for supporting their education. We noted that one of the fellowship speakers was a recipient of the Palm Springs Branch's American fellowship. We introduced ourselves to her and we are hoping to have her as a guest speaker at a meeting.

The AAUW Funds you donate supports American Fellowships, Career Development Grants, International Fellowships and NCCWSL (National Conference for College Women Student Leaders).

AAUW CA President Kathleen Doty provided brief welcoming remarks and also stated that plans are being made to provide more leadership training. For example, this training will assist members in learning how to get along with difficult people, and meeting management, etc. This will be introduced at our AAUW Statewide meeting in 2015.
