THE FUTURE OF TECH IS AT TECH TREK

On a break from their App inventor course at the AAUW National tech trek camp in N.J., a group of girls discussed ideas for apps that might make them money in the future. This was a conversation that could not have occurred at the original Tech Trek camp at Stanford in 1998, nine years before iPhones and mobile apps were invented.

Camp creator Marie Wolbach wanted to inspire middle school girls to pursue math and science studies and ultimately careers. Early camps featured forensic mysteries and hands on experiments which have been at the forefront of Tech Trek camps. The program has now spread from California to 11 other states.

But science and math are ever-changing fields and Tech Trek has had to keep up with the times. Thanks to a grant from Verizon Foundation, coding with the App inventor tool became a class offered at every camp in 2015. A grant from Symantec allowed campers at three sites, including Stanford, to participate in a class on cybersecurity, another rapidly growing field not much thought about until recently.

Tech Trek is trying its best to look into the future and trying its best to prepare a successful path for the students who can take advantage of its opportunities. We can be proud that we have been enthusiastically involved with Tech Trek from its beginnings. (Adapted from *Outlook*.)
