As you face a new year and bring closure to the current year, take a moment to ask yourself what significant changes and events have I experienced in 2015? What positive Goals have I achieved in 2015? Whose life has been positively impacted by my words or deeds? What Goals, with timelines, am I setting for myself to achieve in 2016?

Often at this time of year many of us set New Year’s Goals and Resolutions. Unless we are very serious about these Goals and add a timeline to them, they mean little. They are just a Dream and are often quickly forgotten and ignored.

As President I am very pleased to see the number of Goals and Objectives we have achieved during this year. It was a pleasure to facilitate this strategic planning session and to gather important input from our enthusiastic members. One of the most significant parts of the Strategic Plan was the timelines we set for achieving our Goals.

Although work remains to be completed on some Objectives, I am pleased to report that we have increased our volunteers to support various areas of our organization. In addition to our popular Book Group, Movie Group, and Great Decisions, we have added three new activities to enhance the social interactions between our members: Feasting for Funds, Lunch Bunch, and Happy Hour. We have developed a Buddy System to support our members in addition to a Birthday Greeting card system for members. We have increased our Branch publicity and marketing through the printed Media and our Website. We have developed new Fundraising activities for our Branch. We sent nine girls to Tech Trek Camp at UC Irvine this summer, and members have donated over \$3,815 through our Phantom trip fundraising efforts which began in August.

We have analyzed our Finances and the services provided by our bank, and have changed banks to improve our financial services. We have analyzed our bank accounts and have prepared a long range plan of our expected Branch income and expenditures.

We have also completed the Title IX Public Policy outreach into our Local School Districts to make sure that our girls are being provided equal opportunities in our schools.

There are so many wonderful things happening in our Palm Springs Branch it’s hard to mention all of them. However, none of them would be possible without the enthusiastic support and commitment of our members. I sincerely thank you for your support. Let us continue to work together and have a spectacular year in 2016!
