Stand Up for Women's Rights: Urge Your Senator to Oppose Judge Kavanaugh

Last month, President Trump nominated Judge Brett Kavanaugh to a lifetime appointment on the U.S. Supreme Court and the stakes are enormously high. Despite the fact that his full record has not been released, the Senate has scheduled his confirmation hearings to begin as soon as September 4. AAUW has carefully **considered** his available record and one thing is clear: Judge Kavanaugh would put at risk the issues that are central to AAUW's mission.

AAUW **advocates** for the health, education, and economic security of all women and girls. But Judge Kavanaugh's confirmation would put women's constitutional rights, including access to abortion and contraception, at risk. Judge Kavanaugh has also called into question the protections of the Affordable Care Act, and his record shows that he is willing to do grave harm to women by upending employment and labor rights and restricting voting rights. We cannot support a nominee who will not uphold and protect our most fundamental freedoms and rights.

Judge Kavanaugh's Senate confirmation hearings will begin as soon as September 4, and it's vital that every senator hear from their constituents about what's at stake.

Take action now:

1. **Join a nationwide day of action on August 26 to Unite for Justice.** On Women's Equality Day, Americans will stand united in commitment to women's rights to demand that the U.S. Senate oppose Judge Brett Kavanaugh's confirmation. Use our unique link to **find and register** for an event near you and show up to speak out.
2. **Share your personal story with your senators and urge them to oppose Judge Kavanaugh's confirmation.** Your voice matters! AAUW's toll-free number, 1-855-973-0824, will automatically connect you to your senator's office. Let your senator know what's at stake if Judge Kavanaugh is confirmed – from the erosion of health care coverage for pre-existing conditions to the elimination of access to abortion and contraception.
3. **Share this opportunity with friends and family in key states.** The votes of senators in Alabama, Alaska, Indiana, Maine, Missouri, Nevada, North Dakota, and West Virginia are critical. Urge your networks in these key states to **make their voices heard.**

Judge Kavanaugh has shown he won't stand up for the health, education, and economic security of women and girls — and we won't stand for that. Take action today to oppose Judge Kavanaugh's confirmation to the Supreme Court.

September Member Spotlight

Geraldine 'Gerry' Johnson

How has AAUW empowered me in my life?

AAUW has given me the opportunity to be a leader as president in Klamath Falls, Oregon (in the 1970's) and in Palm Springs, CA (in the 2000's). Most importantly, it has helped me to be capable of working out a solution when opinions differ. Women (and men) in AAUW come from many different backgrounds and experiences and learning to talk and listen to others has been a most important value to acquire. Going to conferences such as in Oregon, California, Boston and New Orleans were wonderful opportunities to hear amazing stories of what in other parts of the world. I think AAUW lives by the rule that "If you're going to complain about something you better suggest a solution as well. Otherwise, you are part of the problem" (Julio Gonzalez of Coachella (1928 – 2018)).

What is my favorite aspect of our Palm Springs branch?

I have belonged to the Palm Springs Branch since the early 1980's. The Home Tours we had in the 80's were wonderful and afterwards we would meet for dinner and discuss the days experiences. It was at one of those that we planned our first book club which was an evening group and it expanded from there. There have been several areas of working with female students to expose them to new ideas and encourage them to become successful young ladies. The areas included math and science, speech, and even interviews for college. It was sad when some of these programs were discontinued but rewarding to know that the programs were taken on by bigger organizations. For instance, when schools didn't teach science, we would go into the schools and have programs for 3rd grade girls. When schools again started teaching science, we stopped doing so and moved onto other areas. Of course, we are still very involved with STEM (although, I prefer STEAM because I like to include ART).

Education/Life's work?

I began my freshman year at Oregon State University in 1955. After two years, I was sick of the rain and decided to go back to California to finish my degree at San Francisco State University. Not knowing what I wanted to do and fields I thought were interesting were not open to women, I got a degree in education and became a teacher in San Francisco. After two years, I married a Swede and ended up living in Sweden for a couple of years. That gave me another education as to how people in other parts of the world thought and behaved.

After returning to the U.S., I became a mother and began a life-long education about being a mother (of 4), grandmother, and great-grandmother. With two small children I began thinking, "What are other women doing? I would like to visit with adult women some of the time. Lo and behold there was an article in the paper about an AAUW meeting. I immediately joined and never looked back! We were young mothers and did many things revolving around our children such as doing children's plays and educational playtime. Eventually, I went back to teaching and received my MA at UC Riverside. I continued to work on my PhD and had course work finished and was about to start the dissertation, etc. when my father died. As an only child I had to forget about the PhD and take care of financial matters in his estate. Again, I went back to teaching until I retired and became a Realtor. Now, I'm basically retiring from that and having more time to read books. Also, I'm planning to revive my playing of the piano which I left in the dust for so long.

What do I do for fun?

I used to travel a lot all over the world but I have slowed down and enjoy Happy Hour with my mini Australian Shepherd, Val. Alexander (a long time friend) and I have season tickets to interesting plays in Palm Springs and Rancho Mirage (soon to be in Cathedral City). Afterwards, we go out to dinner to many favorite places and I bring home left overs that help me get through the week without any serious cooking. I also enjoy visiting with my granddaughters when they are available (teenagers do have busy schedules!). I really enjoy AAUW Book Club every month. It's fun to visit and also to hear what others think about a book that I love or hate.


