Voices for Children-The Riverside County CASA Program

Jessica Muñoz is the Riverside County Executive Director for Voices for Children. Jessica oversees the recruitment, training, and supervision of Court Appointed Special Advocates, or "CASAs." CASAs are very special volunteers who advocate for children in foster care in court, school, and the community. Jessica is an attorney and practiced for over seven years, including four years as a trial attorney in juvenile dependency courts in both Los Angeles and San Diego Counties. Prior to joining Voices for Children, she developed and coordinated a program at UC San Diego to provide support services to students who are undocumented. In addition to her law degree, she holds a Master of Forensic Science degree and a professional certificate in nonprofit management. Jessica is a past chair of the County of San Diego – Juvenile Justice Commission and served on the board of the San Diego Civic Youth Ballet. Tech Trek



Jessal attended two of our three Tech Trek Alumni Club outings. Most recently she and her mom toured the Rancho Mirage Observatory. We hope she'll be able to attend this year's Tech Trek Orientation and fun party to talk to the girls.

Our Tech Trek Committee selected Jessal to attend AAUW-Tech Trek Camp at UC Irvine in 2014. I was able to find Jessal's essay – neatly printed and confidently written when she was 13 years old. At the time, she wrote:

"My hopes and dreams, well lets see. I hope to be very successful and going back to school ...and getting my masters degree....I have saved the best for last... I will then return to college for my PhD....My dream is that I will help people whether by finding a cure for cancer, helping people with the law, or maybe even with a new invention....As long as I'm helping others I know I am making a difference."

Jessal did not wait to graduate college to make a difference. Jessal has been on the OneFuture Health science Academic Pathway taking science classes and participating in community and career internships that are science-related. Jessal Founded and was President of the Cathedral City HS Medical Reserve Corporation whose mission is to educate the community on pressing health issues and disaster preparedness. She has worked within the community to embrace the Chicano culture and support, inform and participate in LGBTQ events around the community. Jessal has also volunteered at the animal shelter, tutored elementary students, provided the community with medical information and given personal testimonies on the benefits of mental health education. This year she has been an intern at Desert Regional Medical Center providing patients care, comfort and assistance.

Included in her scholarship application Jessal's words warmed my heart:

"Although I come from a very rough background, I am still determined to go to college. *It was at Tech Trek Science and Math Camp for Girls that I truly found out what my passion was.* I plan to study criminal justice with an emphasis in forensic science. I ultimately would like to become a crime scene investigator and live a very successful life like the one I've always dreamed of."

Tech Trek has made a difference to Jessal. My dream is that one day our branch will have an AAUW –Palm Springs Branch College Scholarship to give girls like Jessal.
