President's Message by Sharrell Blakeley, Palm Springs Branch President

DUES...DUES...DUES

I feel compelled to discuss the need for all members to renew our memberships and pay dues of \$110, before **June 30**, **2020.** Some of you may question why you should pay dues when it seems like nothing much is happening, there are no

Saturday luncheons and no physical get togethers. Thus far, less than 50% of our membership have renewed. Without sounding preachy and imperious, here are the facts:

As you know, our AAUW Branch does not operate in a vacuum. We are affiliated with both National AAUW and State AAUW. **\$59** of our dues is allocated to our National organization in Washington DC, and most of this is tax deductible. National provides gender equity expertise to Congress and is focused on family security issues related to paid leave and sick leave for nurses (93% of whom are women) child care, and elder care. AAUW's mission also addresses equal pay, student debt relief and voting rights. We must ensure that AAUW receives \$59 from every member across the country so they can continue to be a critical voice in the powerful mission we launched in 1881. We also provide critical fellowships and scholarships that make it possible for women all over the world to do post-graduate research, particularly in health, that benefits all of us.

In addition to the \$59 going to National, our dues also support State AAUW operations in Sacramento. **\$20** of our dues payment is allocated to the State to provide services focused on public policy, Title IX, Branch support, communications, leadership development. AAUW CA, our state organization provides us with much needed support.

So, what remains to operate our annual Branch budget is**\$31.** We have commitments, too that include, among others, website maintenance, bank fees, travel, supplies, printing, postage, and liability insurance

AAUW's National CEO, Kim Churches, recently addressed the COVID crisis in a webinar with these observations : (1) COVID-19 is giving us an up close and personal view of how women are disproportionately affected; (2) women hold the majority of part time jobs and make up the majority of the low wage workforce; (3) more women than men lack basic benefits like paid sick leave, workplace health and retirement plans; and (4) women are more likely than men to be poor and struggling and retired women twice as likely to live at or near poverty.

Our programs will start up again when it is safe! The board is already planning exciting events and programs, both online and in-person for the fall and beyond. By renewing your membership now, you can show your support for gender equity and guarantee that you will be there when our branch is able to gather again.

As we move toward a pandemic recovery, we must seize the opportunity to address these issues and create a fairer, more equitable society. Our work must and will continue to keep women and their families safe, healthy and financially sound in the wake of COVID. We have many dedicated and committed members and I thank you for continuing to support our Branch.

Public Policy

In March, the AAUW-CA Public Policy team reviewed 44 bills and chose to Co-Sponsor 1 bill (SB 973) and support 26 other bills. Between now and election day we will cover those 26 bills. Stayed tuned.



AB 2023 Educational equity: student records; names and gender changes. Would require a campus of the

University of California, California State University or California Community Colleges to update a former student's records to include the students updated legal name or gender if the institution receives government issued documentation.

AB 2228 Public health: postsecondary education; sexual assault kits. Would require, on and after January 1, 2022, California State University, University of California, independent institutions of higher education, and private postsecondary educational institutions to ensure, for each of their respective campuses, that free sexual assault kits and related medical services be available to students.

SB 1073 Medi-Cal; California Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children. Would require the State Department of Health Care services to designate the WIC Program and its local WIC agencies as Express Lane agencies. The bill would require the department, in collaboration with specific entities, such as program offices for the WIC Program and local WIC agencies to complete various tasks, including receiving eligibility finds and information.
