Karen Borja The Director of Legislative and Community Affairs for Planned Parenthood of the Pacific Southwest will join us to clarify the current status of reproductive rights, what to expect going forward and actions needed to protect our access to reproductive health.

Borja has more than 10 years of experience in nonprofit management and grassroots organizing.

Borja is a self-described "translator" between community needs and government. She is adept at directing projects and managing staff, volunteers and board members. Her leadership efforts range from organizer of the 2019 Coachella Valley's Women's March and co-manager of an election campaign, to board member with the Health Assessment and Research for Communities, member of the Women United of the Desert and Director for Desert Healthcare District from January 2019-December 2022. Prior to her current position she was employed as the Riverside County Community Affairs Director with Planned Parenthood of the Pacific Southwest.

Bloom in the Desert Ministries awarded its Community Justice Award to Borja, as vice-president and secretary on the Desert Healthcare District and Foundation Board of Directors.

### Tech Trek Camp and STEM Programs SPF funds update

This quarter we have received generous donations of:

**\$2,290** to our Tech Trek Camp SPF which brings the balance of the account to \$4775 **\$4,100** to our STEM Programs SPF which brings that balance to \$10,643 (to be used over several years)

Goal is 13,000 to fund 10 residential students and 4 virtual students for Tech Trek Camps summer 2023. If we use 3,000 from STEM for Camp tuition we now have \$7775 of the 13,000 goal.

### How have I been empowered by AAUW?

Empowered, maybe, but I'd rather say: INSPIRED. Perhaps, however, *inspired to be empowered!* It's been an eye-opener to think how far women have come in most recent years, the strides that have been made *in all walks of life*. I'm one of those persons who's always carried her "placards" with her; if anyone wishes to listen, okay. If not, that's okay too and I'm mostly silent

except to my closest friends. Since joining AAUW, where conversations can become VERY lively, I find myself speaking up more and asking people to STOP and LISTEN, there's another side to "your story." I'm sometimes amazed at myself; my teachers of long ago would be astounded! Sometimes, my mouth can get me in a little trouble, but this is not something I worry about too much; seems these days it's on to bigger and better things to worry and talk about almost every day. ONE rule, though, I try to keep: Always be respectful and LISTEN to what the other person has to say! This might also be refreshing!

### What is my favorite aspect of our Palm Springs branch?

Possibly, the PEOPLE who are AAUW members, who come together once a month, not only to be sociable, but to hear from the *speaker of the day*, what's going on out there that we don't always know much about. valley to not only save the past, but to establish plans for the future.

It used to be TRAVEL in capital letters, but at my age and with a number of physical issues, those days are over. Thank goodness, I've been able to see and experience much of the world, but yet there are places I've missed. Is this the time to keep subscribing to National Geographic Mag? I have, simply to make note of new journeys, but also to find places I said, "once was enough!" One of my most favorite books to glance through now and then? "1,000 Places to See Before You Die." My "trips" these days amount to a drive (with someone else at the wheel) to the coast, a lovely time in a hotel, visits with old friends, then home again, only to *feel like I've been on a grand holiday!* I enjoy reading if it's something *light*, watch TV in the evenings, chat by e-mail/phone at crazy hours, get to a play or lecture/luncheon now and then, and poke around in the yard, eyeing that the gardener *stays the course*. ### **AAUW Terminates Twitter Account**

On November 9, 2022, the AAUW California Board of Directors voted to terminate its account with Twitter effective immediately. This proposal was brought forth by the Public Policy Committee and approved following thoughtful and careful discussion. The decision was based on a number of actions taken by Elon Musk both before and since his takeover of this social media platform. Primarily, we are concerned that the incidence of hate speech, disinformation, discriminatory and misogynistic rhetoric, and the spread of dangerous and divisive theories will continue to rise under his stewardship.

As an organization that supports equity for women and girls, values the advancement of fair and equitable opportunities for everyone in our diverse society, and opposes hate, violence and harassment against members of any demographic group, AAUW California can no longer be associated with this platform.

AAUW Palm Springs concurs with this decision by the state board and while we had already terminated our branch's account, the board voted to submit a press release to our local newspapers verifying that we in agreement with this decision.



### Elections Finally Over - How'd We Do in '22?

The election is finally over! In addition to an end to the non-stop requests for donations, AAUW members can be pretty happy with the

results. Here are a few highlights:

- $\cdot$  1 woman each was added to the U.S. House and the U.S. Senate, bringing the numbers to 124 (H) and 25 (S)
- · Of the total of 149, 54 are women of color
- · We lost the most powerful woman in government (Nancy Pelosi) but still have a woman on the Minority leadership team, Minority Whip Katherine Clark
- · Governors of 12 states are now women
- · 23% of all mayors across the nation are women, including our brand new and **first** female mayor of Los Angeles, Karen Bass
- 20 women won new seats in the California Legislature and 30 female incumbents were re-elected, bringing the total to 50 but still just 42%
- · All executive positions in California except Governor are filled by women, including Secretary of State, Lieutenant Governor, Treasurer, and Controller, as well

as the Senate Pro Tem

· Proposition 1 prevailed and women's right to control their own reproductive choices is now enshrined in our constitution.

And here are some fun facts:

- · Only 3.2% of all members of Congress to date have been women
- · California has sent more women to Congress than any other state a total of 47 to date
- $\cdot$   $\;$  Vermont is the only state that has never sent a woman to either the House or the Senate

The State Public Policy committee thanks each and every AAUW California member who voted, who assisted in our Voter Education (VE) campaign by spreading our messages on social media, who took the pledge to vote for Prop 1 (we had 437 sign up!) and who worked within their branches to do their own VE events.
