- MEMBERSHIP/ORIENTATION – Retain and recruit new members; host New Members Orientation when deemed necessary; collect information for Finance Officer and ensure inclusion in Membership Directory; write monthly article about new members and attend Board meetings.
- PROGRAM – Develop plan to secure outstanding speakers for eight (8) Luncheon meetings; with majority being AAUW-mission-based; secure a location, ensure A-V capacity, oversee welcome of current and new members and provide greeters.

 1. For the branch cornerstone Tech Trek STEM camp and Alumnae programs.

- TECH TREK CAMP PROGRAM - Members conduct all functions related to annual selection, registration and follow-up of the 7th grade girls selected to attend on campus or virtual Tech Trek STEM Camp, provide TT Camper Orientation and organize after-Camp program in the Fall for the members. Tech Trek Alumnae Group provides STEM-related outings, information on AAUW resume-enhancing opportunities and occasions for TT alumnae to stay connected with the branch.
- PUBLIC POLICY– Members pursue ways to advance legislation that benefits all women and girls, such as voter registration, letter-writing, marching and partnering with other community organizations who support the AAUW mission and/or public policy priorities.
- GOV TREK – Members inform and distribute materials to high school girls and encourage participation in this AAUW program which helps students learn civics and prepare for careers in public service or law.
- FINANCE – VP is responsible for presenting a proposed yearly budget in each January, presenting a monthly budget report to the Board and coordinating reports with AAUW National
- LEADERSHIP – The Board is responsible for leader succession plan and Leadership Training for members so they become knowledgeable of Branch bylaws and policies and procedures
